MEET THE MAYOR-ELECT

Earlier this month, on April 4, the voters elected Scott Shipley as Crestwood's next Mayor. He will be officially sworn in at the April 25 Board of Aldermen meeting, at which time he will assume the role and duties of Crestwood Mayor.

While the City normally shares a Mayor's message each April, this issue of the newsletter will be focused on formally introducing the community to Crestwood's Mayor-elect Shipley:

Former Alderman Shipley began his Crestwood public service career in 2019 when he was first elected as Ward 3 Alderman and was subsequently re-elected in 2021. He also served as President of the Board of Aldermen from 2020-2021 and as aldermanic representative on most of the City's boards and commissions.

Looking forward to this new challenge, Mayor-elect Shipley stated, "I proudly stand with Crestwood's City staff, the Board of Aldermen, and all the dedicated volunteers who serve on our City's boards and commissions. Together, we share a commitment to making Crestwood a great place to call home."

While first elected in 2019, Mayor-elect Shipley's ties to the Crestwood community are much deeper. Back in 1989, he and

his wife Amy chose to start a family and establish roots here in Crestwood. They soon became active members of Our Lady of Providence church and raised four children. Together as a family, they developed a strong sense of faith and a commitment to serving others.

Shipley earned a master's degree in Telecommunications & Information Management from Washington University and went on to enjoy a successful

30-year career with Southwestern Bell and AT&T, where he worked in IT and sales. In 2014, he was blessed with the opportunity to retire early.

Embracing this new chapter, he decided to start a small business and devote more time to giving back to his community

through various service projects with his church, the Boy Scouts, and other local organizations. Since then, Shipley has been able to pursue his passions to hopefully make an impact to those in our community.

As Crestwood's future Mayor, Shipley plans to focus heavily on community engagement, park improvements, and long-term planning for city infrastructure and services.

VANDALISM HITS CRESTWOOD PARKS

LET'S WORK TOGETHER TO KEEP
OUR PARKS SAFE AND CLEAN

The City of Crestwood needs your help to keep our Parks system one of the best in the St. Louis area.

Since the beginning of 2023 there have been three instances of significant property damage at Whitecliff Park. In January, a support railing within the Aquatics Center was damaged; in February, a door on a storage shed was damaged; and most recently, in March, the new fence around the observation deck at the Whitecliff Quarry was damaged.

There have also been smaller incidents of damage that have occurred at several of our other parks throughout the City.

This type of damage does serious harm to the City from the economic costs (damages can range in the tens of thousands of dollars) to the opportunity costs (time, energy, missed possibilities, etc.). The damage also ruins the potential benefits and overall beauty of our Parks for all residents and visitors.

The City is taking active steps at securing our parks, but we can use your help. To achieve our goal of providing superior parks and recreation, the City is asking for you to share with us if you see anything going on. To this end, the police department is offering a \$500 reward for information that leads to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for this damage.

Let's work together to keep our parks beautiful!

BURNING LEAVES PROHIBITED

The Crestwood Department of Fire Services would like to remind all residents that burning leaves and trash is strictly prohibited within St. Louis County and the City of Crestwood, noting "All open burning of yard waste including leaves, brush, or tree trimmings is prohibited."

CODE ENFORCEMENT CORNER

The Department of Public Works would like to remind everyone to remove mold off of all surfaces from siding to fencing, particularly in the spring. This ensures that all surfaces are maintained in a clean, safe, and sanitary condition at all times.

PUBLIC WORKS CORNER: SEWER LATERAL



The City's Public Works Department administers many different programs for residents of Crestwood, including the sanitary sewer lateral program.

This particular program is of note for two reasons – one, residents already pay for the program. Implemented in 1999, all residents pay a \$28 assessment collected each year on their personal property taxes.

Two, the program is one of the least understood, which is why this article is going to try its best to explain some of the differences that apply to this program:

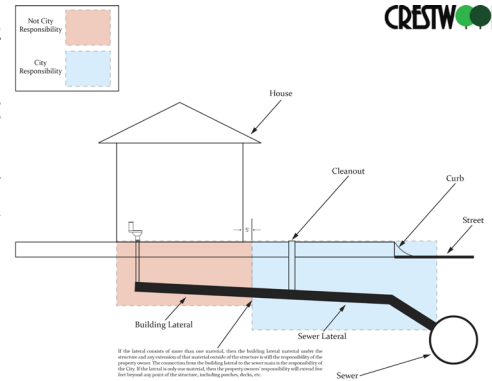
What is a lateral sewer line and why is it important?

Working backwards, down the middle of the street, the St. Louis Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) built sewer collection lines that run down the middle of each block and steer waste to MSD's wastewater treatment plants. What connects each property to those collection line runs are underground pipes called 'sewer lateral' lines.

While these pipes that lead to your home are designed to last for more than 50 years, many things can happen to require their replacement sooner. For example, if your household has kids, they can flush all sorts of items down the toilet in just those moments where they sneak off alone. If kids do flush toys, clothing, or other objects down the toilet, those items might never make it through the lateral line. As these items collect, they obstruct the line, create blockages, and eventually lead to those disgusting sewer backups in our homes.

Not only is this a stinky cause of concern for your family, it could also be much more costly as a problem with your lateral sewer line could cause noteworthy damage to the foundation of your property or even damage your neighbor's property.

Please note that these blockages are YOUR responsibility, not the City of Crestwood... but we are here to help.



Each property owner can get a relatively inexpensive assessment done by a plumbing company, who can tell you if they see blockages when your property is dealing with a sewer issue. Depending on what that blockage is, may qualify you for monetary assistance from the city.

Crestwood's Sewer Lateral Program

The sewer piping in the ground was not meant to last forever and the City recognizes we are a mature City where our infrastructure is showing its age.

If replacement is required, Crestwood's sewer lateral program provides residents a means to repair failing sewer laterals without having to directly pay for this expensive work outright. While the program does not cover the cost of routine maintenance of the sanitary sewer line, it can pay for the repair of nearly any broken section of a sewer lateral from outside the house foundation wall to MSD's main sewer line.

As previously noted, for any homeowner who didn't know what a sewer lateral line was, they probably didn't know that regular service and maintenance could be performed every year or two to keep the lateral sewer line clear. Options include using RootX, a foaming root control which kills roots without harming pipes as well as calling in a licensed plumber to do an annual cabling and cleaning of the pipes.

“As a result of many years of careful planning and disciplined spending, our City enjoys a strong financial footing,” Shipley noted. “We hope to leverage that position going forward to accomplish exciting new improvements for our parks and facilities.”

However, recent dramatic price increases and shortages of new-hire applicants highlight the need for a long-term roadmap of the city’s financial future, Shipley added.

“While our streets are repaired each year, about 30% have issues hidden below
