## SUNCREST FEST 5TH ANNIVERSARY



The Cities of Crestwood and Sunset Hills are excited for the fifth annual SunCrest Fest on Saturday, September 23 at Kitun Park (12343 Eddie and Park Road), next to Truman Middle School.

SunCrest Fest fairgrounds open at 11:00 A.M. and the event lasts until 8:00 P.M. The fairgrounds will feature professional carnival rides with two large attractions, classic carnival games, food booths, kids activities, and more.

Ride bracelets will run \$35 for an all-day bracelet, if bought during the week before (or \$40 day of the event). Half-day bracelets for either 11AM-3PM or 4-8PM will run \$25 (or \$30 day of). Bracelets will be sold at both of the Crestwood and Sunset Hills Community Centers.

The day will kick off with a parade down Eddie and Park Road starting at 10:15 A.M., followed by a car show in the Truman parking lot from 11:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M.

Live music will be played throughout the afternoon including the Apollos (from 1-3 PM), Swing Louie (from 3-4 PM), and McLovin (from 6-8 PM). DJ Shaggy Sounds will be playing music throughout the day, between live performances.

# CRESTWOOD PARK ADDS DISC GOLF COURSE

The City of Crestwood Parks and Recreation Department recently installed a new, nine hole disc golf course at Crestwood Park (behind Long Elementary School, along Eddie and Park Road).

This new disc golf course is FREE and open to the public at all times during the regular park hours - however, the course itself is not lit so please conclude before it is too dark for you or other park users to see the discs.

The City, in partnership with the St. Louis Disc Golf Club, spent more than a year on the layout of the course with safety and simplicity as the driving force to bring this beginner/family-friendly course to life. As seen on the map, the course takes advantage of all available areas of Crestwood Park to make a cozy Par-27 course for the community.

The disc golf course was installed based on receiving many requests during multiple Parks Master Plan discussions over the years. The City also worked with Crestwood's Beautification Committee to make sure the new course was not in the way of any ongoing projects, such as the Back to Nature initiative at Crestwood Park.

At this time, the course is currently using temporary tee/course information signage. This was done strategically to give the City the flexibility to make any potentially needed course adjustments before installing permanent signage, which will take place later this fall.

Once that signage is installed, the City will host a Grand Opening Ceremony that will include food, music, giveaways, and more. Final details of that ceremony will be posted on social media in the coming weeks.



## HOW TO PLAY: DISC GOLF

With the new disc golf course now installed, the Parks Department wants to make sure to share the rules for disc golf for the beginners that will be using our family friendly course. Here are the top four rules and tips for all beginners:

**1. Objective.** The objective of the game is to - like traditional golf - play each hole in the fewest strokes possible. The player with the lowest total strokes (which in disc golf is each throw, or added penalty) for the entire course wins.

**2. Safety First.** Never throw into a blind spot or when other players/park users are within range. Always give other park users the right of way.

**3. Throwing Order.** Each hole begins with a tee throw, followed by the player whose disc is farthest from the hole, in alternating style. When a disc comes to rest in the pole basket, that hole is finished.

**4. Respect the Course.** Observe all posted rules. No littering, graffiti, or abuse of equipment or plantings.
