RESIDENTS TO VOTE ON APRIL 2 BOND ISSUE FOR NEW COMMUNITY CENTER

Crestwood residents will be asked to weigh in on a \$33 million bond issue on the April 2, 2024 General Municipal Election ballot, which, if approved, would allow the City to make the most significant park improvements in decades.

“Our parks and recreation facilities help make Crestwood a great place to live. However, some aspects are aging, and others need to be updated to meet the needs of our community now and in the future,” said Mayor Scott Shipley.

“This marks Crestwood’s most ambitious parks improvement effort since the 1970s.”

The Board of Aldermen approved the following projects to be included in the bond issue:

- Constructing a new community center on the ballfield at Whitecliff Park
- Transforming the existing community center into a pickleball/family games complex
- Replacing the Crestwood Park playground
- Adding a nature play area and walking trail loop to Whitecliff Park

- Adding a pedestrian bridge to connect Whitecliff Park to the Lodgepole neighborhood

These projects were identified as major priorities in the City’s 2023 Parks Master Plan. That plan was developed with significant resident input, including multiple town halls and public outreach events, as well as a community survey.

The largest project will be the construction of a new, modern community



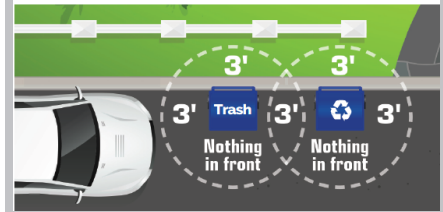
center designed to address resident needs. It will feature a larger multi-use gymnasium, an elevated indoor walking and jogging track, attractive event meeting spaces with a cozy fireplace and outdoor balcony overlooking the park, a larger fitness area with additional and improved equipment, and improved spaces for dance, yoga, cardio classes, and more.

The guiding principle during this conceptual design process has been to address the needs identified by our community with spaces for residents of all ages and abilities.

CHANGES TO TRASH SERVICE ON MARCH 1

Carts MUST be **WITHIN three (3) ft.** of the curb and **MUST be at least three (3) ft. away** from any standing object (this includes mailboxes, vehicles, and other waste containers).



Waste Connections will be continuing its current relationship with Crestwood residents for the next several years, after the Board of Aldermen approved an extension of their current contract.

The new contract increases rates just \$1 to \$21.67 per month for trash, recycling, and yard waste. “We are thrilled with the minimal rate increase,” said Mayor Scott Shipley. “Some communities have seen their rates soar to over \$40 per month as a result of increasing costs and inflation. To achieve this small increase is great news for Crestwood residents.”

When the new contract begins on March 1, ALL Waste Connections services will be fully automated. This will mean that only the contents within the carts will be collected (no materials left outside the cart will be picked up). An appropriate distance is also required for all cans along the curb line.

Waste Connections will assist residents to make sure their trash carts are compatible with automated pick-up. New trash, recycling, and yard waste carts are included in the contract at no charge for those who need them. The carts will be dropped off by the vendor before March 1.

BOND ISSUE TO INCLUDE PARKS IMPROVEMENTS

"During the master planning process last year, residents stated that our current community center was outdated, did not offer enough of the things they wanted to do, and that they would utilize it more often if it were up to date," said Parks and Recreation Director Eilien Ramirez.

"We evaluated renovating and expanding the current building, but it would cost nearly as much as new construction and would impact large natural areas of the park. In addition, renovation would fall short of what the residents were requesting in the Master Plan. Together we determined new construction on the ballfield is the best option."

The existing community center, completed in 1978, will be transformed to better serve one of the fastest growing sports in the country - pickleball. A large portion of the center will be torn down, with outdoor pickleball courts added in its place. The current gymnasium will remain and continue to host indoor pickleball games. The facility will also include a beverage and food service area, as well as a cornhole, shuffleboard, and bocce ball area, to create a fun gathering place.

"The focus for the entire project is to create a place that brings our community together – a place for everyone," added Mayor Shipley.

Bond Issuance

To fund these improvements, the City will be asking voters in April's General Municipal Election – April 2, 2024 – to give the City authority to issue bonds for this project. The bond issue requires 57.14% of votes in favor for the issuance to be approved.

If approved, construction on the new community center would start in 2025, with a completion date in 2026. The pickleball and family games complex would follow, with an estimated 18 month construction timeline.

The City is planning several town halls this spring so residents can learn more about the project and provide their feedback. The first of these gatherings is scheduled for January 18 from 6:00-8:00 P.M. at the Community Center.

CRESTWOOD FY24 BUDGET SNAPSHOT

With the calendar now squarely into January, the City would like to share a snapshot into our Fiscal Year 2024 (January 1-December 31, 2024) budget.

In November, the Board of Aldermen gave approval to a nearly \$20.4 million budget in total expenditures. The City is projecting nearly \$19.2 million in total revenue.

General Fund

The general fund budget for FY24 is greater than \$14 million and is the primary funding source used by the police, fire, public works, and general administration departments. Some of the most noteworthy budget items that are funded within the general fund include:

- Final payment and acceptance of the new Crestwood Fire Truck
- Completion of the median project on Watson Road, around the new Crestwood Crossing
- Traffic calming measures
- Whitecliff Park Bridge construction

Parks and Stormwater Fund

Within this fund, the City has budgeted nearly \$3.5 million in expenditures. In addition to day-to-day operational costs, the City has budgeted for a few large-scale projects such as the addition of a restroom at the Whitecliff Park Quarry and repairs to the Aquatic Center.

Capital Improvement Fund

Within this fund, the FY24 budget will include around \$2.2 million in expenditures including nearly \$850,000 for Citywide street repairs, the addition of a gabion wall along Pardee Road, and future sidewalk projects.

Please note: in the FY24 budget, the general fund has an estimated fund balance reserve of more than 50 percent, a sign of a healthy overall budget.

INCLUSIVE RECREATION SERVICES - AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)

Crestwood Parks and Recreation Department invites people with and without disabilities to participate in our programs and events. Please notify us when you register, or at least three days in advance of the program/event date, if modifications due to a disability are needed to facilitate your participation and/or if there are medications or allergies in which we should be aware. If an inclusion support person is needed to assist the program participant with a disability, it may take up to two weeks or more to provide this type of modification. If we are unable to meet your needs, there is a grievance procedure available for ADA concerns. For assistance in arranging modifications for your participation or to notify us of medical concerns, please contact Terri Johnson, TRS/ CPRP, Executive Director of Municipal Partners for Inclusive Recreation at (314)835-6157, use Relay Missouri 711 or email her at tjohnson@desperesmo.org to discuss your participation.

PROGRAM REFUND POLICY

The Crestwood Parks and Recreation Department strives to provide quality recreation programs for you and your family. If you register for a program and are not able to attend the class, contact the Parks and Recreation Department, a minimum of five days in advance of the program start date, to receive a refund. Once a class starts no refunds will be given. If you are unable to participate in a recreation program due to a health reason, present a physician's statement as proof of illness and/or injury and a refund will be issued. If the program is in progress the fee will be prorated based on remaining classes. If we cancel a program or change the program dates or times not allowing you to participate, a full refund will be issued. Refunds for registrations made with cash or check will be sent by mail to the address on file. Refunds for registrations made with credit card will be credited back to your account. This can take up to 10 days. Trips, camps and special events are exempt from this policy.

ALL FACILITY PASS

Includes Recreation and Aquatic Pass privileges.

RECREATION PASS

Access to Fitness Center, Gymnasium, Racquetball Courts and same privileges as Tennis Pass. It will serve as ID for Aquatic Center, allowing residents to pay resident rates.

TENNIS PASS

Allows passholder to make tennis reservations a maximum of one week in advance.

FAMILY STATUS

A Family is defined as no more than two adults and two dependent children under the age of 23 residing at the same address. Anyone over the age of 16 being included on the pass will need to show proof of residency by the use of a photo ID and/or any other record of residency.

*ADDITIONAL PERSON

This can be added to the Family Passes. Must follow the rules of family status.

FITNESS CENTER

The fitness room is open during normal operating hours of the Community Center. A guardian must accompany youth ages 12 to 14. Individuals 15 to 17 years old must have a parent release form on file at the Community Center to use the facility on their own. No one under the age of 12 will be allowed in the fitness room.

RACQUETBALL COURT USE

All-Facility or Recreation Pass holders may make one racquetball court reservation per day, up to one week in advance. Non-members may play on a walk in basis only. Community Center daily fees apply.

PROOF OF RESIDENCY - ID CARD

Two forms of identification that include your name and address must be provided. One item must be a current photo ID. To qualify for Lindbergh School District rates, Lindbergh residents will need to verify two forms of current residency. Business Membership categories are available to anybody employed by a business located within the appropriate boundaries, with proof of current employment such as current pay stub.

SENIOR MEMBERSHIPS

A 10% discount is extended to all seniors age 62 or over. *Does not apply to ID card or daily admission fees*

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

When the Lindbergh School District cancels school for the day, or if they delay start of the day due to inclement weather, all morning programs and activities at the Crestwood Community Center will be canceled and the center will not open until 10 am. This policy also applies if Lindbergh School District changes to virtual learning for the day due to inclement weather. We will make a decision on all afternoon and evening classes by 11 am. Please watch or listen to our local media for school closures. We will also have the most up to date information on the City of Crestwood Parks and Recreation Facebook and Instagram pages. **The Community Center staff will NOT call program participants to notify them of cancellations covered under this policy.**

KITUN DOG PARK

The 2 acre dog park is located at 12343 Eddie and Park Road. The park has separate areas for small and large dogs. Crestwood residents receive resident rates for annual memberships. Tags are available at the Sunset Hills Community Center 3915 South Lindbergh, Sunset Hills, MO 63127. **Membership valid Jan 1-Nov 30, 2023.**

FACILITY RENTALS

PAVILION RESERVATIONS

Pavilion rental dates are Apr 1-Oct 31.
Restrooms are winterized and closed annually Nov 1-Mar 31

All pavilions can accommodate up to 75 people. Reservations may be made up to one year in advance. Only residents may reserve Whitecliff Park Pavilion #2 or Crestwood Park Lower Pavilion more than 60 days in advance. All reservations must be made in person at the Community Center during operating hours. Reservations cannot be made less than 72 hours prior to the desired date. There are no refunds or rescheduling of reservations due to inclement weather. All pavilions have electrical service. A Special Use Permit is required if you are using a city park and will have: inflatables, tents or other structures, live music, charge a fee or sell anything, or are having a special event. Contact the Community Center to see if this applies to your reservation.

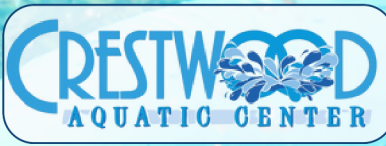

ADMISSION-MEMBERSHIP & ID CARDS PASSES

The Aquatic Center is a Membership ONLY pool. Residents and Non-Residents must have a current ID Card Pass or Membership Pass to gain entry to the Aquatics Center. Those wanting to pay the daily admission MUST have a current ID Card Pass. No other identification will be accepted.

AQUATICS

SWIM & DIVE TEAM

Ages 5-18

The Crestwood Swim and Dive Team is a recreational team with an emphasis on developing basic competitive skills. Swimmers and divers ages 5-18 are welcome to participate, however, the swimmer must be able to swim 25 yards (one pool length) continuously to be able to participate. Practice begins **Tuesday, May 28** on weekday mornings between 7:00-10:00am, depending on the swimmer's age and skill level:

7:00am Ages 11 and over

8:00am Ages 10 and under who are legal in all four strokes

9:00am Ages 10 and under who are not legal in all four strokes

Dive practice will be either 8:00am or 9:00am depending on your availability.

Registrations are to be made in-person at the Crestwood Community Center. Two \$75 volunteer deposit checks are required at registration. Parents/guardians are required to sign up to volunteer for two swim or dive meets AND Prelims/Finals during the season. Checks will be shredded at the end of the season given completion of volunteer shifts. Meet schedule, breakdown of practice times, and other additional information will be provided in the "Welcome" packet that will be available at time of registration. **Registration begins March 25th**

Parent Information/Meet the Coaches event will be **Tuesday, May 14 at 6:30pm** at Rotary Pavilion in Whitecliff Park.

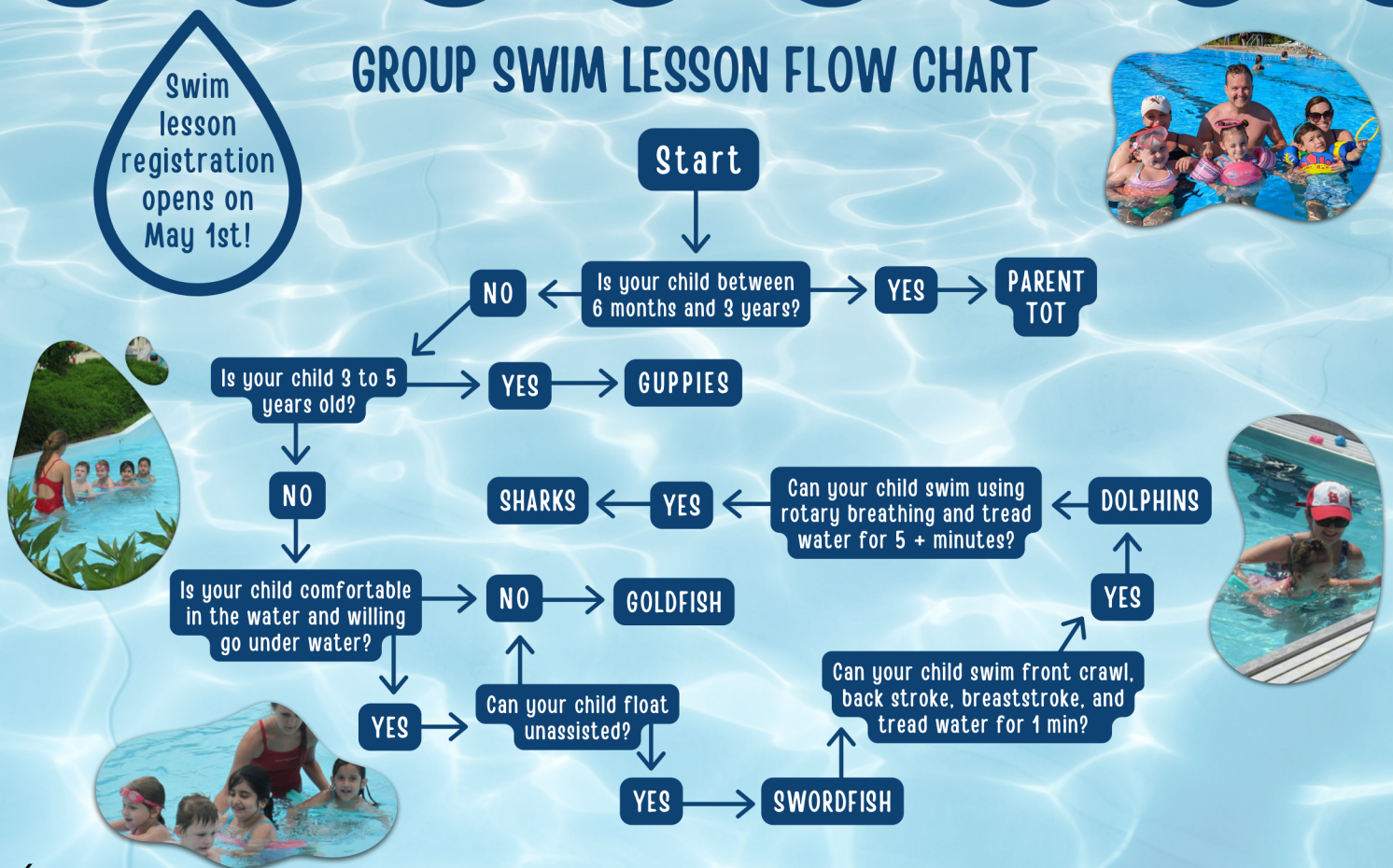

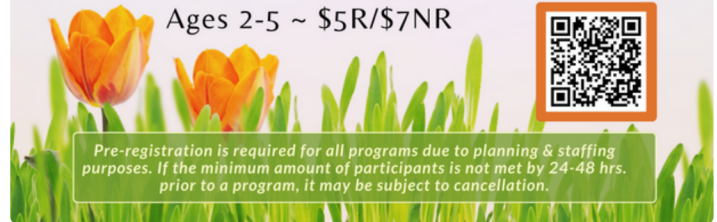
