PROP A UPDATE:

Join Us for the Community Center Groundbreaking

Event Coincides with May 23 Splashtacular

The City of Crestwood will celebrate a major Prop A milestone with a groundbreaking ceremony for the new Community Center at 4 p.m. on May 23. The event will take place at the future site of the facility, on the field directly across from the existing Community Center in Whitecliff Park.

As the largest project funded by Prop A, the new Community Center represents a significant investment in Crestwood's future. To mark the occasion, attendees can participate in a community groundbreaking experience and contribute items for a time capsule commemorating this milestone.

"Rooted in the input we heard from residents, this project is not just a new building—it's a commitment to the people of Crestwood, one that will serve residents of all ages for generations to come," Mayor Scott Shipley said. "I'm proud of the work that brought us to this point and excited for what it means for the City's future."

Following the ceremony, residents are invited to stay for the annual Splashtacular Summer Kickoff from 5-8 p.m. at the Aquatic Center. The

event will feature free pool access, a live DJ, food trucks, games, and activities for all ages.

Construction Timeline & Features

Construction of the new Community Center will begin in the weeks following the groundbreaking and is expected to take 18-24 months. Key features of the new facility include:

Paper Shredding Event May 17

Crestwood is offering residents a secure and convenient way to dispose of sensitive documents at the upcoming Paper Shredding Event on May 17 from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. at the Government Center. This free event is open to all Crestwood and St. Louis County residents, with a limit of five boxes per vehicle. This event is for residents only—businesses are not eligible.

The event is funded by a grant from the St. Louis County Department of Public Health using county landfill surcharge funds.

Beautify Crestwood is seeking volunteers to assist with maintaining the newly designed garden at the Government Center. This landscape improvement was made possible through a partnership between the City, Beautify Crestwood, the City's conservation consultant Angie Weber, and Scott Woodbury of Calalia Garden Design & Wilding. The project enhances the garden beds in front of the Government Center and along Sappington Road, creating a cohesive and environmentally friendly design.

The garden incorporates 64 plant

species, 45 of which are native to Missouri and surrounding states. It is designed for year-round visual interest, with blooms from spring through fall and subtle beauty in winter.

Aquatic Center Daily Admission

To continue providing the high-quality experience the community expects, the Aquatic Center is updating its fee structure in response to rising operational costs. This summer, there will be a single general admission rate: \$8 for Crestwood residents and \$14 for nonresidents. Additionally, all visitors must present a current membership card to be

admitted. Cards can be obtained Monday-Saturday at the Community Center. Crestwood residents must bring two forms of proof of residency, such as a driver's license and a utility bill. Membership cards are \$5 per person for Crestwood residents and \$10 per person for nonresidents. For more information, visit cityofcrestwood.org/187/Aquatic-Center.

Slab Replacement Set for Summer

Concrete slab replacement on select City streets is expected to begin in June and continue through August, weather permitting. Affected streets include Tea Rose Lane, Craigwood Terrace, Cordoba Lane and Pardee Spur.

Residents will receive advance notice if driveway access will be

impacted which may occur for up to seven days during construction, which typically occurs between 7 a.m.-4 p.m.

Gadallah Elected to Board of Aldermen

Will Serve Ward 4

During the April 8 general municipal election, Ward 4 elected Megan Gadallah to the Board of Aldermen with 64% of the vote. She replaces Alderman Tony Kennedy, who could not seek re-election due to term limits. Additionally, Alderman Zavist (Ward 1), Alderman Balles (Ward 2), and Alderman Hall (Ward 3) were all reelected to the Board of Aldermen.

A Crestwood resident since 2013, Gadallah enjoys staying active in the community through school and church activities, sports, and biking with her husband and three children, two of whom attend Long Elementary.

Although she does not have a formal political background, Gadallah's interest in public service began early.

She grew up in a politically engaged family and participated in petitioning, phone banking and rallies. She also worked with the Missouri Public Interest Research Group while in high school. In recent years, she has remained active in community service through her church. As an alderwoman, she hopes to help grow a network of community volunteers to support neighbors in need.

Gadallah looks forward to building connections throughout the city and learning more about residents' needs and priorities. One of her main goals is to identify ways to improve quality of life in Crestwood and work toward meaningful, community-centered solutions.

Report Vandalism With tip411

The City of Crestwood is seeking resident help to protect local parks by reporting vandalism and suspicious activity via the Police Department's tip411 app.

This tool allows community members to submit anonymous crime tips, receive important safety alerts, and connect with the police department from their smartphones.

Over the past few years, vandalism has become more prevalent in Crestwood's parks. Whitecliff Park has suffered multiple incidents of property damage, including a broken support railing at the Aquatics Center, damaged to a storage shed, and vandalism to the fence around the Whitecliff Quarry Boardwalk. Addi-

tionally, other acts of vandalism such as graffiti, cut tennis court nets, and broken glass on display cases have occurred at several parks throughout the city.

"Public safety is a team effort, and a team is strengthened through effective communication," Chief of Police Jonathan Williams said. "Our tip411 app gives the public a quick and easy way to anonymously share information about a crime. Let's work together to keep Crestwood parks beautiful."

These acts of vandalism result in significant economic costs, sometimes in the tens of thousands of dollars, as well as lost time and resources that could otherwise be used to enhance the parks. More importantly, they diminish the enjoy-

ment and beauty of these spaces for all Crestwood residents and visitors.

How to Report an Incident

If you are reporting a crime in progress or need an immediate police response, call 911. For non-emergencies, call 314-729-4800 or report incidents anonymously through the tip411 app, which removes all identifying information before police receive the tips. Those without

a smartphone can send tips by texting CRESTWOOD TIP and their message to 847411. To download the tip411 app, search "Crestwood MO PD"

Discover, Play, & Connect in Crestwood

Welcome to the Crestwood Parks & Recreation Summer 2025 Activity Guide! The Crestwood Parks & Recreation Department offers a wide range of recreational programs, events, and services designed to enhance the lives of residents and visitors. Whether staying active, exploring new hobbies, or enjoying the outdoors, there is something for everyone.

Founded in 1959, Crestwood's parks system began with Ferndale Park and has since expanded to include seven parks spanning 120 acres. The Parks & Recreation Department began full-time operations in 1976, and in 2000, a voter-approved sales tax was introduced to support ongoing park maintenance. In 2021, the department developed its first comprehensive Parks Master Plan, with Prop A funding approved in 2024 for key projects.

Today, the department manages the Crestwood Community Center, Aquatic Center, and City parks while offering a variety of programs, events, and recreational opportunities for all ages.

Program Registration

Unless otherwise noted, program and event registration can be completed online at secure.rec1.com/MO/crestwood-mo, by calling 314-729-4860, or by visiting the Crestwood Community Center in person. Fees for Crestwood residents (R) and nonresidents (NR) are listed throughout the brochure. To receive resident rates, a Crestwood ID card is required; see "Crestwood Resident Benefits" on page 3 for more information.

PASSES & DISCOUNTS

Passes & Discounts

The Parks Department offers a variety of passes to help residents and visitors make the most of its facilities. Whether you're looking for full access to the Aquatic and Community Centers with the All Facility Pass, a more budget-friendly option with the Recreation Pass, or simply want to reserve tennis courts with the Tennis Pass, there's a pass to fit your needs. All passes are nonrefundable.

- **All Facility Pass:** Access to the Aquatic Center, access to the Community Center, allows pass holder to pay resident rates and ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Recreation Pass:** Access to the Community Center, allows pass holder to pay resident rates and ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Tennis Pass:** Ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Senior Discount:** Seniors age 62 or older are entitled to a 10% discount on passes to the Community and Aquatic Center.

Crestwood Resident Benefits

Crestwood residents receive discounted, resident rates on passes for the Community Center, Aquatic Center, Kitun Dog Park, as well as facility and pavilion rentals, programs, and events hosted by the Parks & Recreation Department. Residents also get early access to certain program registrations.

To qualify, residents must obtain a Crestwood ID card, which must be renewed annually. Cards are issued at the Community Center with two forms of identification showing name and current address. One must be a valid photo ID; the other can be a voter ID card, personal property tax receipt, or unpaid utility bill. ID cards cost \$5 per household member but are included with the purchase of an All Facility or Recreation Pass.

Lindbergh School District & Crestwood Employee Benefits

Nonresidents of Crestwood who work in the City or attend school in the Lindbergh School District are eligible for discounted rates on passes for the Community Center and Aquatic Center.

To qualify for Lindbergh School District rates, individuals must provide two forms of residency verification, including one photo ID with a current Lindbergh School District address. Those who work in Crestwood must provide proof of employment, such as a current pay stub.

About the Community Center

Built in 1978 and spanning 22,000 square feet, the Crestwood Community Center, located within Whitecliff Park, is a versatile facility offering a variety of amenities for fitness, recreation, and events. Whether you're looking to stay active, host a meeting, or enjoy a fitness class, the center has something for everyone. The gymnasium often hosts open pickleball sessions, and you'll also find racquetball courts, meeting rooms, a dance gym, and a fitness center. The Center houses the administrative offices for the Parks & Recreation Department.

- **Fitness Room:** The fitness room is open during the Community Center's regular operating hours. A guardian must accompany youth ages 12-14. Individuals ages 15-17 must have a parent release form on file to use the facility independently. No one under the age of 12 is permitted in the fitness room.
- **Racquetball:** All-Facility or Recreation Pass holders may reserve a racquetball court once per day, up to one week in advance. Non-members may play on a walk-in basis only, with daily fees applying.



Room Rentals

The Community Center has three meeting rooms, a multipurpose room and lounge that are available for rentals. Rooms 106 and 107 can be rented together to make one large room. Rentals can be made up to one year in advance and must be booked at least two weeks prior to the event.

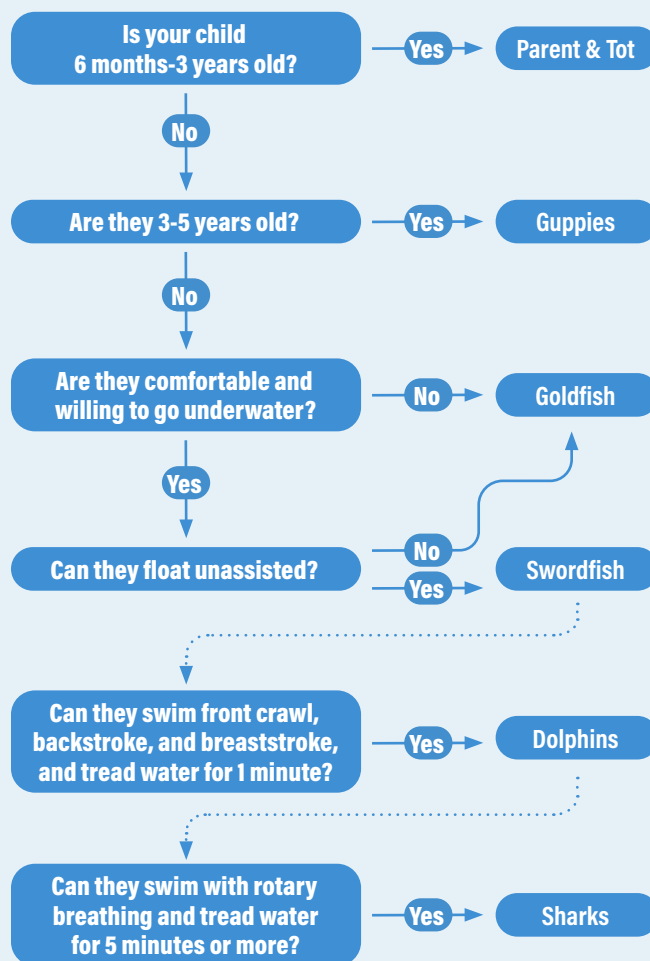

Private and semi-private swim lessons are available for all ages and skill levels, offering personalized instruction to meet swim goals. Private lessons are ideal for focusing on specific skills or overcoming water fears. Semi-private lessons require both participants to have similar skill levels. Lessons begin the week of June 9 and are 30 minutes long. Only one lesson can be made up due to participant absence, and cancellations must be made 24 hours in advance. No-call, no-show participants will not be rescheduled.

Make your special day unforgettable at Whitecliff Park! Enjoy a pavilion rental for your celebration and a day of fun at the Aquatic Center. Your celebration includes:

- **Pavilion Rental** – The perfect spot to gather with family and friends.
- **Aquatic Center Access** – Invite guests to join the fun! Each attendee must pay the applicable daily rate for entry, regardless of swimming. Please note that the 4:30 p.m. daily discount does not apply.

Pavilions are available Memorial Day-Labor Day and are open to those with a current ID card or All Facility/Aquatic Center Pass. A guest count is required seven days before the event. 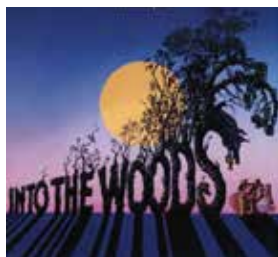
