Join A Community Block Party Sep. 13

Crestwood Night Out is your chance to host or join a neighborhood block party on Sept. 13, from 5–9 p.m. Enjoy visits from the Police Department, Fire Department, Mayor, and elected officials. Sponsored by the Crestwood Police Department, this beloved annual tradition brings neighbors together, builds stronger bonds, and takes a united stand for safety and community spirit.

Whether you're a longtime resident or brand new to Crestwood, it's the perfect night to get outside, meet your neighbors, and enjoy an evening of food, fun, and connection.

New This Year – Let's Party Together!

In past years, Crestwood Night Out has included more than 20 block parties in a single evening. While the enthusiasm has been incredible, the high number of gatherings meant our officers and firefighters could only spend a few minutes at each stop—limiting the chance for real connections.

This year, we're encouraging neighbors to consider joining an already established block party in their ward (see the "Join a Party Near You" chart). Consolidating events means more quality time for our public safety teams and more interaction with residents. Community Resource Officer Dion Olson has already connected



with host neighbors in all four wards, and many are excited to welcome additional households.

Eligible residents can receive a tree planted by the City in the right-of-way near their home—potentially at no cost. To participate, residents must submit an application and select a species from the City's approved list. All planting sites will be evaluated by City staff for suitability. SunCrest Fest Returns Oct. 25

The Cities of Crestwood and Sunset Hills are thrilled to announce the return of SunCrest Fest, presented by Pella Windows & Doors of St. Louis, now set for Saturday, Oct. 25 at Kitun Park (12343 Eddie & Park Road).

Parking is located behind Enterprise Bank (3890 S. Lindbergh Blvd.), a short walk to the festival entrance. A golf cart shuttle will be available for those with mobility needs. Free shuttle service will run continuously from two remote parking locations—South Technical High School and Watson Trail Park—to the main entrance throughout the event.

Trees Matter In Crestwood & Beyond

Caring for our urban forest starts with the trees in our own backyards. Regular watering and pruning are essential to tree health—but it's just as important to understand why trees matter in Crestwood and beyond. From improving air and water quality to reducing heat and supporting biodiversity, trees play a vital role in our environment and community.

In Missouri, trees should be assessed by a certified arborist every three years—or more often if they're large, newly planted, diseased, or in storm-prone areas. Regular inspections help catch problems early, often saving money while preventing property damage or bodily injury.

Helping the Community

- Neighborhoods with trees report stronger social connections, higher civic engagement, and lower crime rates.
- Trees increase residential and commercial property values by an average of 7%.
- Trees reduce stress, lower blood pressure, and improve mental well-being. Access to green spaces is linked to reduced asthma, better job satisfaction, faster healing

in hospitals, and lower rates of obesity.

Battling the Elements, Helping the Environment

- Urban trees reduce stormwater runoff by intercepting rainfall, promoting soil infiltration, and filtering pollutants. A single mature tree can intercept hundreds—even thousands—of gallons of rainwater each year.
- Properly placed trees reduce cooling and heating costs. One healthy tree has the same cooling power as 10 room-sized air conditioners running for 20 hours a day. Shade trees can cut daytime air conditioning costs by up to 58%.
- Urban areas without trees can be up to 22°F hotter than areas with canopy cover. Tree shade cools surfaces, protects public health, and helps reduce heat-related illnesses and deaths.
- Trees remove up to 60% of street-level air pollution, including dust, ozone, and carbon dioxide. U.S. urban trees remove more than 822,000 tons of air pollution each year.




Timing Your Pruning Is Important

To minimize damage and synchronize with the natural growth cycle, prune in winter (January, February). Avoid heavy pruning as leaves are expanding in early spring (April, May), when tree energy reserves are low. Timing for light pruning is less critical. For maximum display of spring flowering species, prune after bloom (June or later). **Prune dead limbs and branches at any time.**


Remove Whole Limbs/Branches

YES



Always cut back to the main trunk, base of a branch or above a bud. This technique respects natural growth patterns.

NO



Do not leave a stub. Do not cut in the middle of a branch or twig. Pruning in this manner creates entry points for decay and pests.

Help Your Trees Thrive

Maintaining healthy trees is just as important as planting them. Improper pruning can harm a tree's health and safety. Scan the QR code or visit cityofcrestwood.org/494/Conservation to learn more about proper tree care.

Support efforts to expand tree canopy in your community—especially in neighborhoods with fewer trees. Advocate for equitable access to green space, connect with local tree programs, or simply start a conversation with your neighbors about the benefits of trees. A PLACE FOR PROGRESS:

Prop A In Action

The City of Crestwood is making major park improvements thanks to Proposition A, a \$33 million bond issue approved by voters in April 2024. Guided by the 2023 Parks Master Plan, these projects mark the most significant investment in city parks in decades.

The largest Prop A project, a \$21.3 million Community Center in Whitecliff Park, broke ground on May 23. The new facility will feature modern fitness and recreation amenities, multipurpose rooms, and inclusive design throughout. An outdoor nature playscape will extend programming beyond the building's walls. Construction is expected to take 18–24 months.

The first completed Prop A project, Crestwood Park, opened two new playgrounds in April. Designed with

community input, they offer inclusive equipment for kids of all ages and abilities. A ribbon cutting on May 6 celebrated the project's successful completion.

What's Next?

Once the new Community Center is complete, the next round of Prop A projects will begin, including:

- A pickleball & family games complex at the existing Community Center (2027)
- A walking trail loop to enhance access within Whitecliff Park
- A pedestrian bridge connecting Whitecliff Park to nearby neighborhoods

Inclement Weather Policy

When the Lindbergh School District cancels school, delays its start, or shifts to virtual learning due to inclement weather, all morning programs at the Crestwood Community Center will be canceled, and the building will not open until 10 a.m. A decision about afternoon and evening programs will be made by 11 a.m.

Participants will not be contacted individually unless an instructor

cancels a class while the facility remains open. The Community Center may close at any time if weather conditions create a risk to the safety of guests or staff.

Crestwood Resident Benefits

Crestwood residents receive discounted, resident rates on passes for the Community Center, Aquatic Center, Kitun Dog Park, as well as facility and pavilion rentals, programs, and events hosted by the Parks & Recreation Department. Residents also get early access to certain program registrations.

To qualify, residents must obtain a Crestwood ID card, which must be renewed annually. Cards are issued at the Community Center with two forms of identification showing name and current address. One must be a valid photo ID; the other can be a voter ID card, personal property tax receipt, or unpaid utility bill. ID cards cost \$5 per household member but are included with the purchase of an All Facility or Recreation Pass.

City Business & Lindbergh Schools Benefits

Nonresidents who work for a business in Crestwood or attend school in the Lindbergh School District are eligible for discounted rates on passes for the Community Center and Aquatic Center.

To qualify for Lindbergh School District rates, individuals must provide two forms of residency verification, including one photo ID with a current Lindbergh School District address. Those who work in Crestwood must provide proof of employment, such as a current pay stub.

The Parks Department offers a variety of passes to help residents and visitors make the most of its facilities. Whether you're looking for

full access to the Aquatic and Community Centers with the All Facility Pass, a more budget-friendly option with the Recreation Pass, or simply want to reserve tennis courts with the Tennis Pass, there's a pass to fit your needs. All passes are nonrefundable.

- **All Facility Pass:** Access to the Aquatic Center, access to the Community Center, allows pass holder to pay resident rates and ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Recreation Pass:** Access to the Community Center, allows pass holder to pay resident rates and ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Tennis Pass:** Ability to make tennis court reservations up to one week in advance.
- **Senior Discount:** Seniors age 62 or older are entitled to a 10% discount on passes to the Community and Aquatic Center.

- Fitness Room:** The fitness room is open during the Community Center's regular operating hours.

A guardian must accompany youth ages 12-14. Individuals ages 15-17 must have a parent release form on file to use the facility independently. No one under the age of 12 is permitted in the fitness room.

- Racquetball:** All-Facility or Recreation Pass holders may reserve a racquetball court once per day, up to one week in advance. Non-members may play on a walk-in basis only, with daily fees applying.




