Mayor's Message: Looking Back at 2025

In January 2025, a severe winter storm dropped more than eight inches of snow and ice on Crestwood. While roads across the region were a mess, our Public Works and Parks teams worked around the clock for a week to plow and treat nearly 100 lane-miles of pavement.

Social media overflowed with appreciation—one comment captured it best: “So glad to be a Crestwood resident!” That sentiment reflects the gratitude and shared values that define our city: service, caring, and listening. Those values, paired with hard work, drove meaningful progress throughout 2025. Let’s take a look back at some highlights.

Parks & Recreation

One of the year’s biggest milestones was the groundbreaking of our new community center, The Cliffs at Whitecliff Park. With foundations poured and structural steel rising, its shape is now taking form—an exciting sign of progress.

Parks also saw major improvements. After extensive community input, the new Crestwood Park playground opened in spring and quickly became a family favorite. We added parking and restrooms at the Whitecliff quarry area and launched the multi-year Back to Nature habitat restoration at Crestwood Park—thoughtful stewardship that will benefit residents and wildlife for years to come.

Recreation programs brought fresh energy in 2025, offering fun for all ages. From splash-filled excitement at the Aquatic Center’s Splashtacular and Christmas in July to community favorites like the updated SunCrest Fest, Touch-a-Truck, and Movies and Concerts in the Park, these events created memorable moments and brought our community together in meaningful ways.

Community Involvement

Residents played an active role in community initiatives throughout the year, supporting honeysuckle removal, creek cleanups, garden restorations, and food donation drives. In May, our Public Works team extended that spirit of service by providing mutual aid assistance to neighboring communities following the May 16 tornado.

Police and Fire continued strong outreach through programs such as Crestwood Night Out, DARE, Cops and Bobbers, Movies in the Firehouse, Fire Prevention Day, and smoke alarm installations.

Your engagement helped guide our work and keep us focused. In 2025, we strengthened communication with expanded social media updates, new e-newsletters, and video outreach—tools that build stronger connections and improve transparency.

City Operations

Crestwood realized more than \$5 million in new direct gains last year through intergovernmental agreements, grants, and careful resource management. These dollars reduce local costs, support major projects, and strengthen our long-term financial position.

The resident-led Charter Review Commission completed its work and presented proposed updates to improve efficiency and clarity in city operations. These recommendations will appear on the April ballot—stay tuned for more information to ensure all residents are well informed.

As we begin 2026, I’m confident we’ll continue to say: So glad to be a Crestwood resident!

Municipal Election - April 7, 2026

The City of Crestwood's General Municipal Election will take place on Tuesday, April 7, 2026. The office of Mayor (3-year term) will appear on the ballot. The deadline to register to vote is March 11, 2026. Scan the QR code or visit cityofcrestwood.org/518/City-Elections to learn more.



Four Charter Changes to Appear on Ballot

Four proposed updates to the City Charter will appear on the April 7 ballot. The Charter Review Commission, appointed by the Board of Aldermen in January 2025, met throughout the year to review the City Charter. Serve Your Community as an Election Judge

The St. Louis County Board of Elections is seeking civic-minded individuals to serve as Election Judges on Election Day. Judges help ensure fair, efficient elections and earn a minimum of \$250 for the day. To qualify, you must be a U.S. citizen and registered Missouri voter, at least 18 years old, able to declare a party affiliation (Democrat or Republican), and willing to attend training and work the entire Election Day (5 a.m.–8 p.m.).

The Board of Aldermen unanimously voted to confirm Ryan Harrell's appointment as the City's next Fire Chief at its November 25 meeting.

Harrell Named New Fire Chief

The City of Crestwood has selected Ryan Harrell as its next Fire Chief, following the retirement of Chief Leo Meyer earlier this year. The Board of Aldermen unanimously voted to confirm Harrell's appointment at its November 25 meeting, and he will officially assume the role on January 2, 2026. Harrell brings more than 26 years of fire service experience to Crestwood. He has served with the

Clayton Fire Department since 1999, most recently as a Battalion Chief, and has held key leadership positions including Battalion Chief of Logistics, Recruitment Officer, and Public Information Officer.

"Crestwood has a strong foundation and a great team in place," Harrell said. "I'm excited to build on that success and work to achieve great things for our community."

Winter Reminders: Keep Crestwood Safe and Clear

As winter weather returns, please remember a few important City ordinances that help keep our neighborhoods safe and accessible:

Clear Sidewalks

Property owners, tenants, or occupants are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks in front of their property as soon as possible. Keeping sidewalks clear helps prevent slips and allows everyone—from students to mail carriers—to get around safely.

Snowfall Parking Rules

When there's one inch or more of

snow or ice, street parking is allowed on only one side of the street:

- Odd-numbered years: Park on the odd-numbered side.
- Even-numbered years: Park on the even-numbered side.

Because we're in 2025–26, please park on the odd-numbered side during snow events. This helps snowplows clear roads safely and efficiently.

Firewood Storage

If you store firewood outside, keep it at least five inches off the ground and behind the front of your home to prevent pests and maintain neighborhood appearance.

2026 Budget Preview

At its November 25, 2025 meeting, the Board of Aldermen approved the FY2026 budget, which aligns with the calendar year. This budget reflects the City's commitment to maintaining strong financial health while investing in essential services, infrastructure, and community amenities.

The FY2026 budget is organized into five primary funds:

General Fund

2026 Expenditures: \$14.9M

The General Fund is the primary funding source for the Police, Fire, Public Works, and General Administration departments. It will also support major projects in 2026, including:

- Replacement of the large playground at Spellman Park
- Resurfacing projects
- Various Aquatic Center improvements
- Parks and street maintenance
- Infrastructure upgrades at the Government Center

Note: The General Fund currently maintains a reserve exceeding 70% of the budget—an indicator of strong financial health.

Capital Improvements Fund

2026 Expenditures: \$2.8M

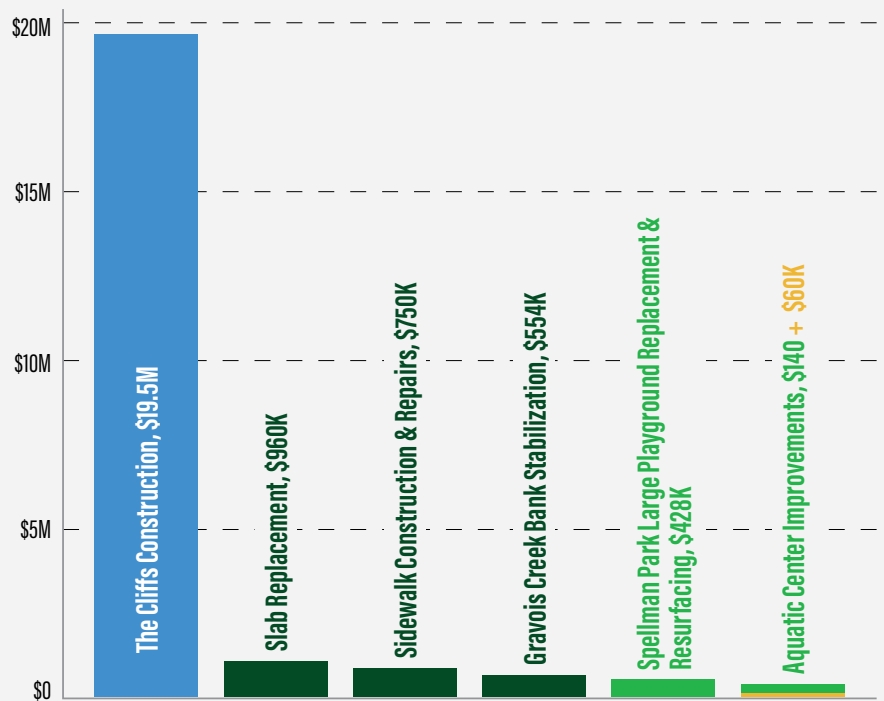
This fund supports the City's largest one-time capital projects, including significant investments in streets, sidewalks, and essential vehicles such as snowplows and pickup trucks.

Park and Stormwater Fund

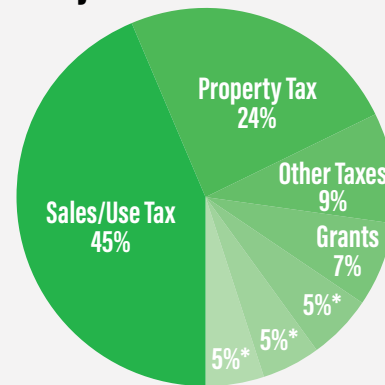
2026 Expenditures: \$2.8M

improvements within the Parks and Recreation Department. Key projects include:

- The “Back to Nature” project at Crestwood Park
- Funding for the City's street program
- Implementation of new program registration and rental software

Debt Service Fund

2026 Expenditures: \$19.5M

Formerly known as the Proposition A Fund, this fund covers costs associated with constructing The Cliffs at Whitecliff Park, Crestwood's new community center, and other Proposition A projects.

In April 2024, residents approved Proposition A, authorizing the City to issue General Obligation Bonds—the lowest-cost borrowing option for municipalities.

These bonds allow the project to be funded now and will be repaid over 20 years.

Sewer Lateral Fund

2026 Expenditures: \$188K

This fund is dedicated exclusively to sewer lateral repairs and is supported by an annual \$28 flat fee included in personal property taxes.

A PLACE FOR PROGRESS:

The Cliffs Takes Shape in Whitecliff Park

If you've visited Whitecliff Park recently, you've seen the future rising before your eyes. The Cliffs—Crestwood's new community center—is well underway, and construction remains on schedule for completion in late 2026. What began as a vision shaped by resident input is now becoming a reality, one beam and brick at a time.

Much of the underground work is complete, and the walls for the gymnasium and lower-level spaces are now in place. From the elevated walking track to flexible classrooms and a cozy event space overlooking the park, every detail is designed to serve our community for decades to come. This \$21.3 million project, funded through Prop A, represents the largest investment in recreation in Crestwood's history—and it's being built with care.

Behind the scenes, engineers, architects, contractors, and City staff collaborate daily to ensure quality

and attention to detail. The building's modern-craftsman design will feature natural stone and wood accents, honoring the park's quarry heritage while creating a warm, welcoming space for fitness, programs, and gatherings.

Earlier this year, residents helped choose a name that reflects this unique setting: The Cliffs at Whitecliff Park. It's a name that speaks to strength, beauty, and connection—qualities that define Crestwood itself.

As progress continues, we're reminded that this isn't just about bricks and mortar. It's about creating a place where neighbors meet, families grow, and community thrives. When The Cliffs opens its doors, it will mark more than the completion of a building—it will be the start of a new chapter for Crestwood.

Stay tuned for more updates as The Cliffs continues to take shape. Until then, take a walk through Whitecliff Park and watch the future unfold.

Inclement Weather Policy

When the Lindbergh School District cancels school, delays its start, or shifts to virtual learning due to inclement weather, all morning programs at the Crestwood Community Center will be canceled, and the building will not open until 10 a.m. A decision about afternoon and evening programs will be made by 11 a.m.

Participants will not be contacted individually unless an instructor

cancels a class while the facility remains open. The Community Center may close at any time if weather conditions create a risk to the safety of guests or staff.

Crestwood Resident Benefits

Crestwood residents enjoy discounted rates on:

- Community Center and Aquatic Center passes
- Kitun Dog Park memberships
- Facility and pavilion rentals
- Parks & Recreation programs and events

Additional perk:

- Residents also receive early access to select program registrations.

How to qualify:

Residents must obtain a Crestwood ID card, which:

- Must be renewed annually
- Costs \$5 per household member (included with All Facility or Recreation Pass purchase)
- Is issued at the Community Center with **two forms of ID:**
 - » One must be a valid photo ID
 - » The second can be a voter ID card, personal property tax receipt, or unpaid utility bill

City Business & Lindbergh Schools Benefits

Nonresidents may qualify for discounted Community Center and Aquatic Center passes if they:

Work for a business in Crestwood

- Must show proof of employment (e.g., current pay stub)

Attend school in the Lindbergh School District

- Must provide two forms of residency verification, including:
 - » One photo ID with a current Lindbergh School District address
 - » The second can be a voter ID card, personal property tax receipt, or unpaid utility bill

Passes & Discounts

The Parks Department offers a variety of passes to help residents and visitors make the most of its facilities. All passes are nonrefundable.

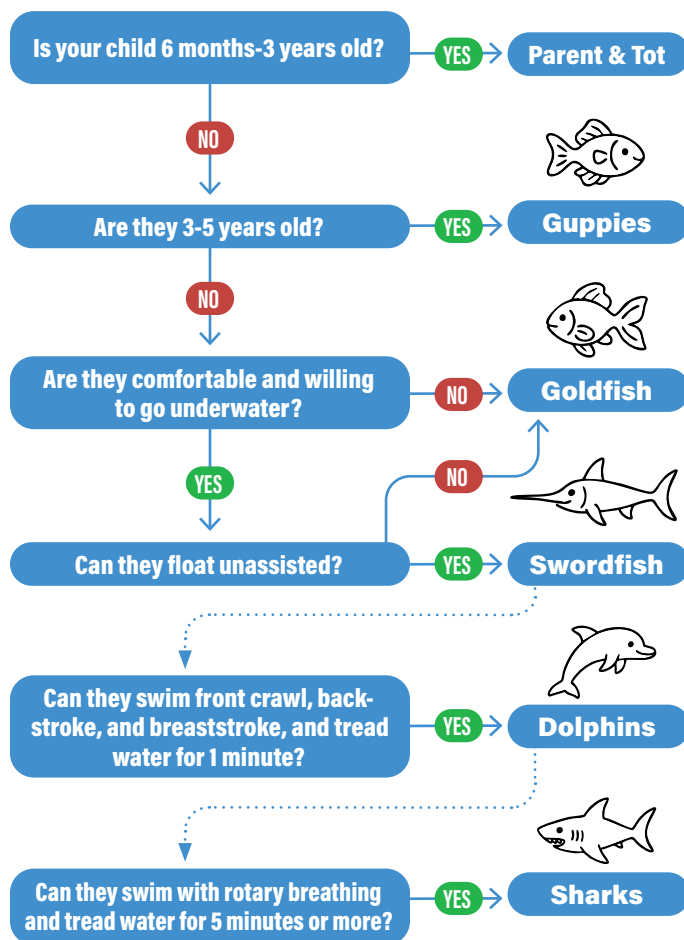
