## 2019 PREVIEW OF THE YEAR

**CRESTWOOD RESIDENTS HAVE MUCH** to look forward to in 2019: the completion of Rayburn Park renovations, newly updated and ADA accessible locker rooms at the Crestwood Community Center, concrete street slab replacements, continued sidewalk repairs, and more!

In 2018, the City started renovations on Rayburn Park after earning a Municipal Park Commission grant from St. Louis County. The project is expected to be finished in Spring 2019. Updated park features include a new playground equipped with a gravity swing, improved lighting and pathways, among other things.

Several residential streets are slated for concrete slab replacements and sidewalk repairs. Streets scheduled to be repaired include Dalcrest, Raycrest, Arban, Buxton, and Glencrest. These streets have been in place for more than fifty years. Additionally, the City will continue to repair deteriorating sidewalks throughout the City.

Locker room renovations at the Crestwood Community Center are almost complete. The new locker rooms are now ADA accessible and updates include new bathroom stalls, flooring, fixtures, and other amenities. New flooring will also be installed in main area of the Community Center

In 2018 Walpert Properties negotiated an option to buy the Crestwood Mall site from Urbanstreet. Walpert began recruiting tenants in October, and are diligently working

to put a deal together. Their concept calls for first-floor retail with apartments above, a movie theater and entertainment destination, and a large office building. The early signs are positive, and we expect more news and announcements in 2019.

After a successful and widely celebrated first year, the City will once again partner with Sunset Hills to host the second annual SunCrest Fest on Saturday, September 7, 2019. The community event features carnival rides, games, live music, food trucks, and more!

Parks and Recreation staff continue to improve existing programs and develop new concepts. There are a number of new fitness classes starting this spring, and additional information is provided on page 2.

City staff looks forward to an energetic and productive 2019!

## NEW TRASH CONTRACT



For the last eight years, Crestwood has contracted with Meridian Waste Solutions for residential waste hauling. Residents should continue to pay Meridian for this service through March 31, 2019. On April 1, 2019, Crestwood will be changing the City's waste hauling contractor to Waste Connections of Missouri. The service provided by Waste Connections will not change from your current service and will include:

1. Weekly pickup will be on the same day.
2. Weekly pickup will include unlimited: waste (trash), single stream recycling, and yard waste.
3. Free pickup of large household items (can be picked up by two people), the third pickup of the month. The pickup cost at any other time will be \$20.00. Residents must call Waste Connections 48 hours in advance for pickup.
4. The pickup cost of household metal goods such as appliances and hot water heaters (can be picked up by two people) will be \$20.00. Residents must call Waste Connections 48 hours in advance for pickup.
5. The cost for waste hauling service is \$19.00 a month, which will be billed quarterly at \$57.00.

6. Free pickup for single stream recycling and yard waste is included.
7. The cost for those residents in the Senior Citizen and/or Disabled Residents Limited Income Program is \$5.23 a month, which will be billed quarterly at \$15.69.
8. The cost for those households with at least one person 65 years or older is \$17.10 a month, which will be billed quarterly at \$51.30.
9. Handicap (valet) pickup, with the waste container at the top of the driveway, outside of the garage or house, will be provided at no additional costs for residents that can provide a doctor's note stating they are unable to place the waste container at the curb.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT PROJECT LIFESAVER



**THE CRESTWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT** will be the first community in St. Louis County to take part in Project Lifesaver - a program designed to help emergency responders locate vulnerable individuals who are prone to wander. Through training and the use of radio tracking equipment, Project Lifesaver greatly reduces the response time for locating wanderers and maintains a 100 percent success rate.

Due to the generous donations from local organizations, including Christmas in Crestwood, Environmental Heating and Cooling, Sam's Club, and Spectrum Eyeglass Repair, the City was able to purchase the radio tracking equipment that is required to provide the service.
