WHITECLIFF QUARRY LAKE RENOVATION

YOUR INPUT NEEDED FOR \$250,000 WHITECLIFF QUARRY PROJECT

The City has been preliminarily awarded a Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund grant to redevelop the quarry area at Whitecliff Park. The City is seeking input from the community to identify features and priorities for the redevelopment. In order to collect community feedback, the City has developed a survey for citizens to share their input.

The Whitecliff Park Quarry Project has been on the City's wish list for 20 years since our 1999 Whitecliff Park Master Plan was written. The City has hired Bond Architects to help the City update the Whitecliff Park Master Plan and design the project.

Crestwood Mayor Grant Mabie said "the City is thrilled that we were awarded this grant. Staff worked hard on the application and this is a significant opportunity to bring more people to one of Whitecliff's hidden gems."

Hard copies of the survey are available at the Crestwood Government Center and Crestwood Community Center. The online survey will be open until August 31.

STREET LIGHT OUT? CALL AMEREN

Ameren is responsible for maintaining all city streetlights. Residents should report streetlight outages directly to Ameren at 800-552-7583 or solutionscenter@ameren.com. Don't forget to include the address and pole number.

WARM WEATHER PET SAFETY

Even with windows cracked, the temperature inside your vehicle can increase within minutes. If the outside temperature is 80 degrees, the inside of your vehicle can reach 99 degrees after 10 minutes, and 114 degrees after 30 minutes. When in doubt, leave your pet at home!

WALKING SAFETY TIPS

- Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from the traffic as possible.
- Cross streets at crosswalks or intersections whenever possible. If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic and wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely.
- Never assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.



RESIDENTIAL STREET TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

The city has established a street tree planting program where property owners can submit an application to get a street tree planted in the public right-of-way. Property owners can select one of two options:

1. Tree to be planted and paid for by Property Owner.
2. Tree to be planted and paid for by the City of Crestwood or subcontractor. The number of trees planted annually will be determined by available city funding.

To qualify for a street tree, the available treelawn must be at least five feet wide and free of overhead and underground utilities. A complete list of requirements and approved tree species are available on the street tree application.

CRESTWOOD AWARDED LOCAL RECORDS PRESERVATION GRANT

The City of Crestwood is over 70 years old, and maintains records going all the way back to our founding in 1947. Those ordinances, resolutions, proclamations, and meeting minutes, are becoming yellowed and extremely fragile due to their age. The records also exist solely in paper form and are stored at the Government Center. A fire, flood, or other disaster could result in the total loss of these vital documents. Recognizing this problem, staff applied for and received a \$5,000 records

preservation grant from the Missouri Secretary of State's Office. This grant will enable the city to image roughly 17,500 pages of documents. The City will start with our oldest records and image as many as possible until funding runs out. The records will be digitally scanned, making our records accessible via computer. The records will also be preserved on microfilm, with one copy sent to the Secretary of State for permanent preservation.
