CITY PROJECTS UPDATE

THE CITY COMPLETES MILL & OVERLAY STREET WORK, MAKES IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CRESTWOOD AQUATIC CENTER AND FINISHES RECONSTRUCTION IN GOVERNMENT CENTER BASEMENT.

MILL & OVERLAY STREET WORK

The City recently completed Mill and Overlay street work on over 13 residential streets in Crestwood. The project improves the pavement condition of our City streets and is part of the overall pavement management of the Crestwood street system.

CRESTWOOD AQUATIC CENTER PROJECT

Completed in spring 2020, the Aquatic Center Project was partially funded by a Municipal Parks Grant. Improvements include a Massive Splash spray feature, net replacements, new sound system and speakers, new lap lanes and various other maintenance replacements.

GOVERNMENT CENTER RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

After the flood in August 2019, reconstruction plans in various areas of the Government Center were initiated. The basement portion of the project, which includes Fire and Public Works Administration, were recently completed. Improvements in the lobby, Board of Aldermen Chambers and City Clerk offices are scheduled to be completed later this year.

ZONING CODE UPDATE

A review of the City's Zoning Code began in spring of 2018. Since that time, City staff has worked closely with planning firm PGAV and the Planning and Zoning Review Commission to revise our current zoning code. The updated code is expected to go before the Board of Aldermen before the end of the year.

MAJOR CHANGES TO THE ZONING CODE

- Watson Road Overlay Area
- New use table and use descriptions with more permitted uses to make it easier for new businesses to locate in Crestwood.
- Reorganization of several chapters of City Code into one chapter to create a more unified development code.
- A streamlined development review process to reduce the amount of meetings a development has to go through.

OVERVIEW OF LANDSCAPE SURVEY RESULTS

The City published a Landscape Preference Survey to gather feedback about landscaping for commercial and residential properties in Crestwood. We received approximately 130 responses. Below is a high level summary of the results.

- More landscaping in our non-residential developments.
- Mix of landscaping types and locations in residential districts.
- About half of respondents felt that there should be at least one tree in front of a home.
- Moderate to heavy tree canopy coverage on residential streets.

BLURBS

YARD MAINTENANCE FOR FALL

TREES: The best time to prune your trees is between Halloween and President's Day. When pruning, remember to remove dead wood, avoid obstructions, provide clearances, and trim for proper structure.

LEAVES: Do not blow or rake your leaves off your property. Take extra care to avoid blowing leaves into the street or down storm drains. Leaves should be collected and bagged for your yard waste pick up. Burning leaves is not permitted in Crestwood.

MESSAGE FROM THE CRESTWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Crestwood Fire Department will be testing fire hydrants within the City through the end of October.

CRESTWOOD ANIMAL SHELTER THRIVES DURING TRYING TIMES

DESPITE THE CHALLENGE OF OPERATING CRESTWOOD ANIMAL SHELTER DURING THE COVID19 PANDEMIC, "THE LITTLE SHELTER THAT COULD" IS CHUGGING ALONG.

When St. Louis County safety measures went into effect, the shelter's leadership made the decision to put the few dogs in its care into foster homes in order to limit the number of volunteers at the shelter. It was not possible for all of the cats to go into foster homes, so a majority of them stayed at the shelter. Volunteers worked their shifts solo, while those who worked in pairs were given the option to continue to work together or to alternate shifts with their partner.

Adoptions became contactless, with the shelter's president delivering adopted animals to the front porches of their new homes, while

waiting outside for the "all's well" sign from the new adopter. In spite of this somewhat awkward new process, Crestwood Animal Shelter has already found homes for 12 dogs and 70 cats this year, which is more than any other year in the shelter's history!

The shelter's two major fundraisers were cancelled due to the pandemic, but its dedicated volunteers continue to come up with creative ways to raise money online. Crestwood Animal Shelter has been added as an approved recipient for NextDoor's "Sell for Good" program, and their website has been improved to make it easier to support the shelter with a "Donate Now" button.
