Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. Board President Bland led everyone in the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Minutes:

Police Board President Bland requested a motion to approve the September 19, 2016 minutes. Mr. Kreilich made a motion and Mr. Prior seconded the motion. Motion carried and was declared passed.

General Business:

Police Department Report: (Chief Arnoldy)

Chief Arnoldy discussed the following:

September Report

- 8 assaults, 4 of which were domestic violence
- 1 burglary, Church on Garber
- 17 stealings, including 8 shopliftings
- 2 property damages, including a tree in Whitecliff Park
- 3 stolen vehicles, 1 was recovered

October Report

- No assaults
- 2 burglaries
- 23 stealings, 9 shopliftings
- 6 property damages
- Fraud from the credit card Florida investigations

Missouri Police Chief Accreditation Process:

The Accreditation Sergeant position remains in the budget for 2017. The resolution by the Police Board was mentioned in the Ways and Means meeting.

Promotional Process for Lieutenant and Sergeant:

Rich Noland had been promoted to Lieutenant and Michael Ford to Sergeant and they will be sworn in at the B.O.A. meeting tomorrow.

Hiring Process for Officer:

Officer Lance Rensing has been hired to fill the open officer position. Once the accreditation process gets approved, there are two other well qualified people from this round of hiring that would possibly be good candidates for the position.

2017 Budget Process:

After discussion at the Ways and Means meeting, the sally port and Accreditation position will both remain in the budget. The first reading of the budget will be at the November 22, B.O.A. meeting.

St. Louis County Public Safety Sales Tax Proposal:

It is a half cent Public Safety sales tax that will be involved in sharing between the County and municipalities with Police departments, based on population. An article in the Post Dispatch was viewed by Board members and there was a discussion of the possibilities of how it will proceed.

Aldermanic Report:

Alderman Stadter:

- The last meeting was held on October 25, and there was a 3rd quarter financial report and a presentation of the 2017 draft budget by the City Administrator.
- There was an amendment to section 26 of City ordinances regarding short term vacation rentals.
- Reviewed and approved the site plan for the Police Department sally port.
- Proposed amendment to section 26-366 which is an application for Board of Adjustment review.
- November 9th, the Ways and Means committee reviewed the 2017 budget for a 2nd time.
- November 15th, the B.O.A. met and discussed the upcoming property tax ballot item for April.
- Chief Arnoldy mentioned that the Aldi's location requested a few more hours for delivery services and the Board gave the store six months to see how the new scheduled hours work.

Old Business:

- Alderwoman Stadter reported that there has not been much further discussion on the possible merging of Police and Fire Boards to date. There was a discussion about the Board's structure and the experienced interests of its members on whether to merge or not.

New Business:

- None.

Public Input/Comments:

- None.

Next Meeting:

- There was a motion made by Mr. Kreilich and seconded by Mr. O'Connor to cancel the upcoming December 19 meeting and schedule the next meeting on January 23, 2017. Motion was passed.

Adjournment:

- Police Board President Bland requested a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Prior made a motion and Mr. Kreilich seconded. On voice vote, motion passed. Meeting ended 8:12 pm.
