Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. Board President Bland led everyone in the pledge of allegiance.

Roll Call:

Welcome Mr. David Bruns of 12109 Eddie & Park Road and Mr. Mark Giesing of Crestwood, as new Board members.

Approval of Minutes:

Police Board President Bland requested a motion to approve the May 15, 2017 minutes. Mr. Prior made a motion and Mr. Kreilich seconded the motion. Motion carried and was declared passed.

General Business:

Police Department Report:

Chief Arnoldy discussed the following:

May

- 1 sexual offense of juvenile male by a family friend, victim taken to child advocacy center, offender in custody.

- 3 burglaries, Kia Rio stolen from garage, items stolen from a camera store and gas range stolen from an open garage of a residence under construction on Garden Rock Drive.
- 2 assaults, neither were domestic violence
- 19 stealings, 8 were shopliftings
- 7 property damages, 2 business, 3 residences and 2 vehicles
- 6 stolen vehicles, 1 recovered in Crestwood, 5 recovered in the City and 1 in Webster Groves.
- 8 frauds, 3 credit cards, 3 identity thefts, 1 failure to return leased property and 1 counterfeiting.
- 1 drug offense, possession of marijuana
- 3 public peace offenses, including annoying phone calls, trespassing and resisting arrest
- 12 animal calls
- 73 people related, including 70 medical emergencies, 2 sudden deaths and a suicide.
- 57 suspicious activities
- 7 fugitives arrested and in custody

June

- 3 burglaries, 1 on Buxton, Medallion, and one on Garden Rock Drive a new construction.
- 6 assaults, 2 involving domestic violence, 5 of the 6 were people who knew each other.
- 15 stealings, 11 were shoplifting, 6 of the 11 were cleared with all of them being adults.
- 3 property damages, 1 residence, 1 vehicle, 1 City concrete on Silvercrest had initials and hashtag information in it was tracked. Public works will handle the concrete work.
- 1 fraud, fraudulent use of a credit device
- 2 drug, possession of marijuana, possession of heroine
- 4 public peace, 2 disorderly conducts, 1 peace disturbance, 1 trespassing
- 11 animal calls
- 1 DWI
- 70 people related, including 69 medical emergencies, 1 sudden death
- 1 juvenile offense
- 49 suspicious activity calls

Missouri Police Chief Accreditation Process:

Sgt. David Gray is continuing to be on task for directives, more orders are ready for rotation.

Hiring Process for Officer and Dispatcher:

Junora Moore, Andrew Weusthoff and Adam Greeno have been hired. Another officer is going through the physical and psychological phases. Adrienne Dixon was hired as dispatcher.

Personnel:

Detectives John Kaeshoefer and Rob Leesman left the department in June to enter into the restaurant business in Owensville, Missouri. This leaves some openings in the department.

Sally Port Project:

It was started a week ago, demo has been done and the footings are being started.

V-Academy Training:

Officers have been turning in completed online training and it is working out well.

2017 Vehicles:

The vehicles are complete, with the grant light bars installed. The fleet is in good shape.

Aldermanic Report:

Alderman Charboneau:

- B.O.A. discussed new and replacement sidewalks with Public Works.
- Side yards, setbacks, sheds and playground sets to be brought up in future meetings.
- Christmas in Crestwood awarded
- Grants for the Crestwood to make sidewalks ADA compliant
- Insurance chosen for Crestwood employees with incentive and penalties.
- Boards and commissions changes, dissolving or restructuring.
- 2 Public hearings held about the new MSD building for Public Works.
- Fire Department overtime budget discussed due to work comp.

Chief Arnoldy discussed the concerns of Rosaire citizens and the traffic cutting through the neighborhood. The department is aware of the concerns and has not seen enough traffic to be a consistent problem.
