All Facility Pass

Includes Recreation and Aquatic Center pass privileges.

Recreation Pass

Access to Fitness Center, Gymnasium, same privileges as Court pass. It will serve as ID for Aquatic Center, allowing residents to pay resident rates.

Resident Aquatic Center Pass

Good for admission to the Crestwood Aquatic Center. Pass holders may bring up to four paid guests daily.

Non-Resident Aquatic Center Pass

Good for admission to the Crestwood Aquatic Center. Pass holders may bring up to two paid guests daily.

Court Pass

Allows pass holder to make racquetball and/or tennis reservations a maximum of one week in advance. Ability to make walleyball reservations a maximum of one week, but no less than 24-hours in advance. Only pay court fee, no guest fee for pass holders.

Nanny/Babysitter Pass

Available to Family All Facility or Family Aquatic Center Passes. Pass holder must apply with the family that is employing them and provide proof of employment. Pass can only be used when the holder is with a family member. Pass holder must be age 16 or older.

Proofs of Residency - ID Card

Two forms of identification that include your name and address must be provided. One item must be a current photo ID. To qualify for Lindbergh School District rates, Lindbergh Residents will need to verify current residency. Business Membership categories are available to anybody employed by a business located within the appropriate boundaries with proof of current employment such as a current pay stub.

Family Status

A Family is defined as no more than two adults and two dependent children under the age of 23 residing at the same address. Anyone over the age of 16 being included on the pass will need to show proof of residency by the use of a photo ID and/or any other record of residency.

Senior Memberships

A 10% discount is extended to all seniors age 62 or over.

Swim Lessons

Swim lessons are based on skill levels and are divided into a variety of different groups to accommodate for all types of swimmers. Deadline to register is one week prior to start of date. All classes are 30-minutes in length, and will consist of 8 classes.*

SHRIMP: (Ages 6 months - 3 years)

Intended to develop comfort in and around the water. *Parent accompanies child in the pool.

SEAHORSE: (Ages 3+)

Teaches buoyancy, breath control, and introduces basic water skills.

STARFISH: Learning unsupported floating and kicking, while front crawl and back crawl are introduced.

GUPPY: Continue to work on front crawl and back crawl, learn elementary backstroke, and begin diving.

FLIPPER: Introduction to sidestroke, deep water bobbing, breaststroke kick, and continues work on previous strokes.

SEAL: Continuing stroke development and adding the dolphin kick, treading water, & breaststroke.

SAILFISH: Build endurance while being introduced to the butterfly, front and back crawl flip turns.

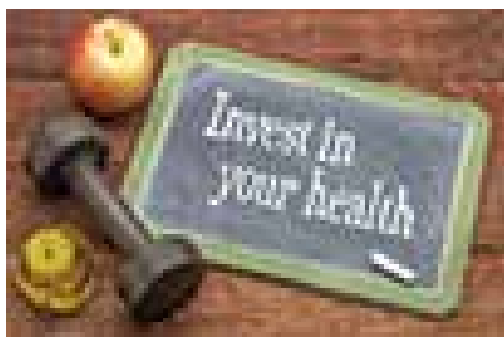

Historic Sappington House

House Tours

The Sappington House, at 1015 S. Sappington Road in Crestwood, was built in 1808 during the presidency of Thomas Jefferson. The restored site is an outstanding example of Federal architecture, popular during the post-revolutionary period, but rare in Missouri. The furnishings from 1780~1830 enhance the elegant ambiance. The Sappington House is judged to be the oldest brick home in St. Louis County and has been on the National Register of Historic Places since 1974.

The museum is open for touring Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and the third Saturdays 11:00 am - 2:00 pm; \$5 per adult, \$1 per child. Group museum tours may be arranged through the resident manager, Sally Cakouros, at (314)822-8171. A 19-minute DVD of the tour is available for viewing in the Library of Americana by those physically unable to tour the two-story home.

The Library of Americana and Decorative Arts

Not a lending library, the Library of Americana and Decorative Arts is a research library of early American history and artifacts. Resources on practical household items like quilts and silverware and also fine arts like paintings and music are included in this extensive collection of exceptional books.
